Guest speaker will be Howard Latschaw of Emlenton R. D. 3, director of organization for the Pennsylvania Farm Bureau Co-operative Association.

Mr. Shirik also said three members will be elected to three-year terms on the organization's board of directors.

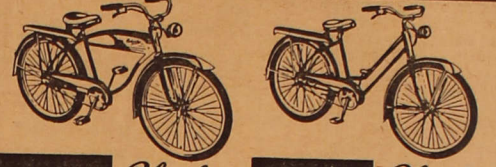

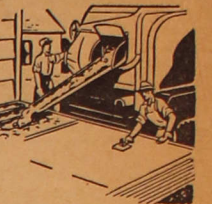
